We hear that the new 75 miles long Wolds trail (The Lindum Trail) is almost ready to have its official opening. However the government's recent cutbacks may affect funding to Councils and other bodies who are supporting this route. The route is open to carriage drivers, horse riders, cyclists and walkers. It will also be available to disabled carriage drivers. The concept was devised by local carriage drivers and aims to encourage and promote countryside access in the Lincolnshire Wolds for the local community and visitors to the area.

PHC committee has decided to have a drive over part of this route on 10<sup>th</sup> October, followed by a bring-your-own-food barbeque where we can get together and have a good social afternoon. PHC will provide the BBQ.
